Reading:

Learning to understand fiction, poetry and non-fiction texts by decoding vocabulary and discussing meaning, reading individually and within a group.

SPaG:

Learning spellings, punctuation and grammar in line with the year 2 National Curriculum.

Writing:

Learning to build sentences with conjunctions, adjectives and, through the study of high-quality texts, for example:

- *'The Snail and The Whale'* by Jill Donaldson
- *'The Colour Monster'* by Anna Llenas

Place Value:

Using a place value chart, partitioning numbers to 100, estimate numbers on a number line, count in 2s, 5s and 10s.

Addition and subtraction:

Adding and subtracting 10, adding three 1-digit numbers, comparing number sentences.

Shape:

Recognising 2-D and 3-D shapes. Counting sides and vertices on 2-D shapes. Counting faces, edges and vertices on 3-D shapes.
