#### **Year 4 Trip**



# This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
EYFS	It's fruit and vegetable week! We have been reading 'The Runaway Pea' and working on our observational drawing skills as we challenge ourselves to draw different types of fruit and vegetables. We have been designing our own healthy plate making sure we take inspiration from the food pyramid and discussing what our favourite fruits and vegetables are!  In drawing club this week, we have been taking the boy and penguin from Oliver Jeffer's story, 'Lost & Found' on different adventures around the globe. Some children drew them in Australia having a party with kangaroos and koalas, others took them to the aquarium to swim with the fish. We have been focussing on adding detail to our drawings of people and animals. In phonics, we have learnt the digraphs /sh/ /th/ /ch/ /ng/ and /nk/ and have practised reading and writing these in words.	In Maths, we have been exploring different ways to make 5. We have used our subitising skills to identify 4 and 5 in different contexts and to find one more and one less than different amounts. We have been singing lots of 5 songs including: five little frogs, five little ducks and five currant buns!
Year 1	Year 1 have produced some creative writing linked to the song/book 'Walking Through The Jungle'. They have practised using question marks to complete the phrase: Walking through the Jungle, What do you see? We are continuing to gain accuracy and independence by saying the sentence out loud before writing it and using our sounds independently to spell words.	We have been learning to subtract a part from the whole. E.g. If I had 9 apples and somebody ate 2, how many were left? We would love you to continue supporting this concept at home with lots of practical and visual ways around the house. We also want the children to make fact families and see the connection between parts and the whole, e.g. 2+6=8 6+2=8 8-2=6 8-6=2
Year 2	This week in English we have read 'The Bear and The Piano' by David Litchfield focusing on the vocabulary and how the author uses adjectives to describe how the bear was feeling. The children have planned and written their own retelling of the story. They have worked hard to ensure they have the correct order of events and have used expanded noun phrases to develop their descriptions.	In Maths this week we have continued our addition and subtraction unit. We have worked on subtracting two 2 digit numbers and answered mixed addition and subtraction questions. The children have worked hard to ensure they are using the concrete resources to support their learning and recognise whether the question is asking them to add or subtract.
Year 3	English - Year 3 have been looking at inverted commas this week and how to use them in dialogue. Using the conversations had between Plop the Owl and the other book characters, the children got into role and pretended what questions they would ask each other in a conversation. The children were then able to write their questions in dialogue format, correctly using inverted commas.	Maths - Moving on multiples of 4 this week, the children have really enjoyed chanting and moving along to the Supermovers 4 timetables. They have also looked at how else multiples of 4 can be shown, such as using arrays, addition sentences, bar models and groups.
Year 4	One of the highlights of our week was our exploration of the lost gardens of Heligan through the use of imagery. We delved into the works of Laura Carlin and Shaun Tan, both renowned artists known for their adept use of mixed media. Inspired by their artistry, the children created beautiful concertina booklets, using a variety of materials to bring the vivid descriptions of the lost gardens to life. In addition to our artistic endeavours, we also embarked on a trip to Dudsbury Hillfort. The trip was both educational and enjoyable, allowing the children to deepen their understanding of hillforts. Back in the classroom, they channelled their newfound knowledge into creating informative leaflets about hillforts.	In maths this week, we have been focusing on the 3, 6, and 9 times tables in more detail. The children have now shifted their attention towards solving reasoning problems that require the use of these tables, so that the children can apply their knowledge in problem-solving contexts.
