**This Week:**

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
Reception	<p>In Reception Class this week, we have been learning the story of the Princess and the frog. We have read a few different versions and written our own potions to turn a Prince into a frog.</p> <p>In Let's Explore, we have played with water at every opportunity to help us keep cool during these very hot days... The children also have had the opportunity to choose their own art and creative work focus this week too.</p>	<p>In maths, we have been thinking about time. We have sequenced our days using morning, afternoon and evening and used first, then and later to describe other sequences.</p>
Year 1	<p>In English this week, each Year 1 child wrote a letter to a child in Reception class, explaining what Year 1 is like. They enjoyed reflecting on the year, producing some lovely, reassuring letters. We have also reviewed all of our phonics knowledge from this year and even enjoyed going on a 'word hunt' outdoors, where the children applied their knowledge.</p>	<p>In maths, we have covered our final topic; place value to 100. We have practised identifying how many tens and ones are in a given number and sequenced numbers out of order. The children have completed maths assessments and we will spend next week reviewing less secure topics.</p>
Year 2	<p>This week in English we have investigated the problems caused by pollution in 'The undersea cleaning spree' The children have been thinking about how the different characters feel about the situation and how they would describe each character.</p>	<p>In Maths we have continued our unit on weights and measures. We have measured mass in kg, compared volumes and measured volume in ml. The children have persevered in what is a tricky topic at a difficult point in the school year.</p>
Year 3	<p>Year 3 write some lovely Haiku poems about seasons this week. We also enjoyed Michael Rosen's poem 'Don't' and we created our own versions by changing the verbs.</p>	<p>We have been measuring mass this week. The children know the units kg and g and can read different types of scales. We are now comparing mass using <i>greater than</i> and <i>less than</i>. We have also been problem solving using magic squares.</p>
Year 4	<p>This week, the children have been cooling off after a busy few days of performing by learning about the Commonwealth games. This year, the games will be taking place in Birmingham and we have learnt all about the history of the games, the countries that take part, the athletes themselves and even had a go at creating our own sport that could be in a future games!</p>
