This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
EYFS	In English this week we have been exploring the traditional tale, Jack and the beanstalk. We have been retelling the story using our deep giant voices and creating our own beanstalks out of paper, card, playdough and bricks. We have planted our own seeds and can't wait to see if they grow into our own magic beanstalk! We drew pictures and wrote ideas of what might be at the top.	In Maths we have been learning about tangrams, using 2D shapes to build pictures and challenged ourselves to make our own tangrams. We have also been using the language first, now and then to build number sentences. We used cubes to measure the length of different beanstalks and have been using number ladders to practise adding on to 10.
Year 1	In English this week we have been reading Handa's surprise. We have been describing Handa and the all the juicy fruit in her basket using adjectives and adding in more detail to our sentences using conjunctions.	In maths, we have started to look at multiplication in its simplest form by identifying equal groups and adding equal groups using repeated addition. The children went on a number hunt to find ladybirds with varying numbers of spots, they then had to put themselves into groups of equal spots and add them up by counting in 2's, 5's or 10's. We have also started to look at arrays and used a song to help us remember rows and columns.
Year 2	This week in English the children have produced two great pieces of writing. We have written a recount of the King's Coronation – imagining an alien arrived on Earth and we had to explain what was happening. The children have also continued their research into Mary Anning and written very informative fact files. They have focused on their sentence structure and laying out their fact file clearly and carefully.	In Maths this week we have finished our Fractions unit. We have recognised and found ¾ and counted in fractions up to a whole. We have now started our Time unit, focusing on o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. The children have coped very well with a tricky topic.
Year 3	This week in maths, year 3 have started the unit 'time'. We have focussed on the foundations of reading an analogue clock, recapping from year 2 learning. We have then moved onto reading time to 5 minutes and 1 minute. This is a very tricky concept, but with the use of resources and continued practice of reading a clock, we will get there!	Year 3 have been writing a newspaper report this week on an event that happened in our class story 'Brain Freeze'. The children are all really enjoying this story and I have been impressed with the formal language and 'news reporter' style they have used.
Year 4	This week has been art week in Year 4. The children have researched different sculptors, created images based on birds' nests and then created their own birds' nest sculpture using lots of different materials. Alongside this, they have been practising their computing skills by typing up their Tutankhamun reports from last week to create some spectacular newspaper front pages.	In maths this week the children have started the new topic on money. They have looked at how to convert amounts from pound to pence (and back again), compared amounts of money and ordered them too. They have also practised the very important skill of estimating amounts of money, something that we all do every day when we buy something online or at the shops.
