Dear Parents,

Welcome back to this – perhaps the busiest and most exciting part of the school year. It has been great to see the children return from a half term of glorious weather, ready to get to grips with the last leg of this academic year. Year 2 - Blashford Lakes



Year 2 had a wonderful time at Blashford Lakes this week. We went pond dipping and found lots of efts and pond snails. We went on a mini-beast hunt, sorted them into categories and the children had a go at tree bashing! Finally, we had a great time river dipping and found bullhead fish and more newts. The children behaved brilliantly and asked lots of interesting questions. There were many soggy socks and wet trousers for the journey back to school but the children had a great trip!

Sickness Policy

At Hampreston, we are passionate about attendance. We believe that children should have good attendance of at least 95% in order to make the very best start to their education and to build solid foundations for their futures. Many of you will have noticed our increased prompting and support for children whose attendance is lower than we expect and I hope the regular reminders of your child's attendance is helpful to you.

Where attendance is concerned, we acknowledge that is it a very delicate balance since we actively promote good attendance, but also understand that some parents may feel additional pressure to send children into school. As a rule of thumb, if your child is unwell, they should remain at home. However, there have been many occasions where children are being kept at home because they are a little tired, or feeling 'under the weather'. In some – rightly, not all – of these situations, the children probably could have attended school.

However, we are vigilant with sickness and diahorrea. If a child is sick, they must remain at home for 48 hours for the protection of the rest of the school community. Hampreston, like all schools, is a close community where sickness bugs can spread rapidly given the right circumstances. We make no exceptions with sickness, and ask that families are mindful not to attempt to diagnose reasons for the sickness – we simply do not want to have other children or members of staff put at risk.

Finally, might I also ask for a little polite courtesy from you all when dealing with members of staff when they contact home and ask for a child to be collected. We do follow national policy on sickness so it is simply not acceptable to verbally abuse members of staff for carrying out their responsibilities in keeping children safe. Staff will always go the extra mile to care for poorly children and should not be subject to sarcastic, abusive or threatening behaviour in doing so.

This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
	Save our oceans! This week we have been exploring the oceans, learning how many there are, what lives inside them and how we need to protect them from pollution. All of this was building towards our very exciting school trip to Bournemouth Oceanarium today. The children had a blast identifying all the different marine life and sharing their knowledge with others.	
EYFS	In English, we have been exploring the text 'Not Now Bernard' and using it to inspire our own monsters. We have been drawing pictures of monsters with different shapes, colouring and sizes and using adjectives to describe them.	In Maths, we have been doubling. We have sung our doubling song and have played lots of doubling games which have also helped develop our turn taking skills as well as practising winning and losing. We have also used paint to create our own butterfly doubles!
Year 1	This week in English we have been focusing on our phonics, in particular spotting the split diagraphs a-e, e-e, i-e, o-e and u-e. We have read lots of real and alien words with these diagraphs in and practised spelling some of these words too. We also played 'text detectives' and tried to spot any split diagraphs in our reading books and in other material that we have read this week.	In Maths this week year 1 have been counting forwards and backwards from 50-100. We first counted in ones, then in tens, this then helped us to partition any given number between 0-100 into tens and ones.
Year 2	This week in English the children have written a recount of our trip to Blashford Lakes. The children have worked really hard to include all the detail of pond dipping, mini beast hunting and finding fish in the river. The children have also written instructions for how to pond dip and find the best creatures.	In Maths this week we have started our new statistics unit. We have looked at tally charts, tables, block diagrams and pictograms. The children have really impressed me with how much they have remembered from our ICT units on using tally charts and pictograms to represent data.
Year 3	This week in English, year 3 have been exploring books from the same author. We have focussed on Quentin Blake. The children have really enjoyed sharing, talking and reading a range of his books. They have written letters to Quentin Blake, reflecting on the things they like about his stories and asking him 2 questions. We will be posting these and hopefully he will receive them. The children are very excited about this.	This week in maths, we have started an angles unit. The children loved making their right-angle monster munchers and we used the school grounds and the classroom to find right angles. To challenge the children more, they then had to find acute, obtuse and right angles within the school setting.
Year 4	The children have made an excellent start back after half term. We have had a fantastic geography week looking in detail at Florida. We have looked at the climate, comparing it to our own; learnt about the Kennedy Space Centre and why it is in Florida; looked at how Floridians prepare for hurricanes and how wildlife can be safeguarded and preserved in Florida.	Next week the children will be completing their multiplication table check, so in preparation we have been completing lots of times table activities in our maths lessons. The children have been focussing on increasing their fluency and being able to recall any multiplication or division as quickly as possible. The children would all benefit from as much practice as possible over the weekend!
