This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
	This week has been Christmas week! We have made glitter decorations, acted out the Christmas story, made paper chains, and decorated the classroom. We have thoroughly enjoyed practising our nativity songs in preparation for the performance next week.	
EYFS	In English, we have been writing letters to Santa and making cards for our class elf, Sprout. We have been recapping all of the phonics graphemes we have learnt this term and practising reading and writing our tricky words.	In Maths, we have been making Christmas repeated patterns, ordering numbers, and completing Christmas colouring with a mathematical twist!
Year 1	The children have been working really hard on their performance skills whilst practising this year's nativity. We have also been focussing on phonics during English sessions. We have been recapping all the new and alternate sounds we have learned this half term in preparation for the half termly phonics quizzes. All the children have worked really hard with their sounding, blending, chunking and decoding.	In maths, we have been putting all the strategies we have learned into practise to help us solve addition and subtraction problems. We have counted up cubes, used 10 frames and counters, drawn dots, crossed out and taken away objects, used our fingers and our knowledge of number bonds.
Year 2	This week in English the children have completed an independent write describing Santa's workshop where all sorts of problems have happened. The children brilliantly described what they could see and have applied their knowledge of expanded noun phrases to make their sentences more exciting.	In Maths this week the children have completed arithmetic and reasoning assessments. They have all worked really hard to answer some tricky questions and I am very proud of how well they have done.
Year 3	This week, the children have learnt about imperative verbs (bossy words!). Using these, the children have written their own recipe on how to make bird seed cake following a practical science lesson. I have been impressed with not only the use of imperative verbs, but the use of time connectives and accurate layout of what a recipe needs.	This week, the children have recapped some of the trickier concepts learnt over this half term in preparation for the end of term maths quizzes! Towards the end of the week, the children have enjoyed creating their own Christmas board games and playing them against each other. It was lovely to see all the children use their creativity in maths!
	This week has been a busy one for our Year 4 children! They've been putting their maths skills to the test in assessments and have been doing a fantastic job applying what they've learned throughout this term.	
Year 4	In addition to their maths, the children have been getting creative during our Design and Technology week. They've been busy using pneumatics to make amazing moving Christmas window displays. The children have really enjoyed the design process, worked brilliantly in different groups and have put their imaginations to work to create some truly impressive displays.
