This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics	
EYFS	Dinosaur week! We have been learning the names of different dinosaurs and looking at their different body parts. We used this to make our own pasta dinosaurs, cut and stick dinosaur skeletons, build dinosaurs from our construction equipment and hunted for fossils in the sand pit.		
	In English, we have been reading 'The Everywhere Bear'. We drew and wrote our own adventure for the Everywhere Bear to go on.	In Maths, we have been recapping repeated patterns and solving problems. This has been a great chance to link all of our learning about colours, 2D shapes, 3D shapes and numicon numbers.	
Year 1	This week in English Year one have been using the suffix 'ed' to change present tense verbs to the past tense. We have also been looking at the fairy tale of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We used pictures from the story to retell different parts. We also had a go at retelling the story by acting out different parts to the rest of the class.	In maths we have been revisiting both addition and subtraction number problems with missing numbers. We used cubes, number lines, part whole models and bar models to help us work out the missing numbers. We also looked at balancing number problems, filling in missing numbers to make them the same on each side so as they balance or equal to each other.	
Year 2	This week in English the children have been consolidating their knowledge by writing sentences containing common exception words and completing SPaG activities. They have also worked hard on their reading comprehension.	In Maths this week we have completed end of term assessments and reasoning questions. The children have shown how much they have learnt over the term and the year as a whole. They are thinking about how they found their answers and justifying their choices.	
Year 3	In English this week, children have created their own synopsis of the 'Bee Musical', ready to advertise on their posters! They have also been writing some effective sentences using lots of brilliant adjectives, similies and onomatopoeia.	This week in maths, year 3 have finished their statistics unit. They have been focussing on their arithmetic practice by making maths board games, ready to share and play with their peers. The 4 and 8 time tables have also been another focus this week!	
Year 4	This week has been a rollercoaster for Year 4. They all had a fantastic time at their Middle Schools on transfer day and they loved telling us all about their new classes, teachers and football pitches! All of the children have put in an incredible amount of effort to make our end of year production a real smash hit. We could not be more proud of all their efforts. To top off an already busy week, Year 4 have taken part in a DT week. They have been researching, designing and creating light boxes; drawing on their skills of joining different materials and combining this with their learning about electrical circuits from earlier in the year.
