Your support has meant that our school has gained a whopping £362.50 in commission which means books that every single child can access and enjoy at school.














#### Celebrating Neurodiversity: 13th-19th March

## This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
EYFS	This week we have been exploring different types of materials and finding out if they are hard, soft, strong or brittle. We also conducted a science experiment by mixing a few things together which really surprised and amazed the children by making a volcano! It's been a very fun packed week.	
Year 1	This week in English Year 1 have continued to write their version of Jasper's Beanstalk. We have worked hard to add in extra detail and use their knowledge linked to our science topic of what plants need to help them grow. Towards the end of the week, we also practised using their very best handwriting to create a special piece of writing that you might get to see on Sunday.	In maths Year 1 have continued to work on numbers within 50. We have practised counting in 1's forwards and backwards, we have identified 1 and 2 more than a given number, we have counted in tens and we have also started to partition numbers into 10's and 1's using oractical resources to help us.
Year 2	This week in English we have read Where The Wild Things Are by Maurice Sendak. The children loved hearing about the Wild Things and thought about what they would do if they were Max. We wrote a story based on the book, however, the children had to follow the story mountain structure and come up with a new adventure for Max to go on. They worked really hard to think about how Max would travel, what mischief he would get up to and who would help him.	In Maths this week we have finished our length and height unit and started our unit on mass, capacity and temperature. The children have worked really hard to use the four operations to support them solving two step word problems. We have also investigated how to compare mass and started to look at the different units of mass.
Year 3	Year 3 have really enjoyed writing their forest stories this week. They have impressed me with the use of descriptive language and prepositions. We have looked at the author Anthony Browne and used his books 'The Tunnel' and 'The Forest' as inspiration. Well done year 3!	We have moved onto volume and capacity this week. The children have a good concept of what volume and capacity means. We have practiced reading different types of measuring jugs and working out how much is left over.
Year 4	This week the children have been focusing on developing their artistic skills. Inspired by an artist determined to make art more accessible, they have created sensory artworks using pins. They have also looked at the artwork of printmaker Rachel Parker and created their own repeated pattern artwork. This involved using a specific artistic process to create a tile and then using computer software to turn these tiles into a perfect repeated pattern.
