
### Music at Hampreston

# This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

|        | English  | Mathematics   |

|        | This week we have been learning all about London. We identified where it is on the map, and used Google Earth to take a closer look at some of London's famous landmarks. We then used our construction equipment to build miniature models of our favourite. Have a look at Tapestry for our fantastic creations!   |   |
| EYFS   | In English we have been learning to re-tell the traditional tale, Little Red Riding Hood. We have loved dressing up as each character and using our voices to tell the story.  We have been learning about talk partners, and working  | In Maths we have continued our learning of numbers 11-20; recognising each numeral and putting them into the correct order. We have been learning to subtract by playing ten pin bowling which has also helped develop our knowledge of number bonds to 10.   |
| Year 1 | with our talk partner to answer questions about the story.  This week in English we have been developing our understanding and use of adjectives. We have come up with lots of different adjectives to describe various animals. We made them as interesting as we could to help make our writing even more exciting for the reader.                           | In maths we have been exploring capacity and volume. We went outside and used the water tray and sand pit to fill up lots of different size containers. We completed challenges to compare the capacity of each container and used mathematical language to say if the container was full, nearly full, half full, half empty, nearly empty or empty. We also compared the volume of water or sand in the containers identifying which had more or less inside. |
| Year 2 | This week in English we have been hunting for fossils! The children have had great fun hunting for fossils and wrote a set of instructions for Reception class to follow if they would like to have a go. The children have worked really hard to include imperative verbs and adverbs.  | In Maths this week we have continued our unit on fractions. We have recognised and found a quarter and a third. The children have worked really hard to share between four and three groups and recognised which fraction is greater.   |
| Year 3 | The children have been learning how to write a persuasive letter this week using the Secret Garden as a prompt. They have all used amazing emotive and persuasive language to convince Mr Craven to keep the garden open. Well done year 3.  | We have started our new unit this week on Money - a tricky concept when we don't use coins very often these days! However, the children have all showed a good understanding of finding amounts and converting pounds to pence.  We will continue with money next week.   |
| Year 4 | This week the children have been focussing on the discovery of Tutankhamun. They have researched the discovery and have started to plan out a newspaper article about it. They have put themselves in the character's shoes and have thought about what they might say to newspaper reporters, writing their responses as a conversation and as direct speech. | In Maths, the children have been continuing to develop their understanding of decimals. They have looked at how to partition decimals in lots of different ways and how to use their understanding of place value to compare decimals too.  |
