This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
Reception	In English this week, we have learnt the Superworm story ready for our wonderful trip to Moor Valley. Then in the second half of the week we read different versions of Goldilocks and the Three Bears which we used to help us write sorry letters to the three bears as Goldilocks. In our phonics work we are still practising the tricky words for this year and we learnt the ed word ending as well.	In maths, we have been sorting into sets this week and thinking about how and why we organised the objects in certain ways such as yellow and not yellow or short and long.
Year 1	This week in English, we have focused on our class chapter book, 'The Boy Who Grew Dragons'. We have really enjoyed reading this book together. The children used their imagination to write about the pros and cons of living with a pet dragon.	In maths, we have completed the position and direction unit. The children have learnt their left and right. They were then able to describe position and give directions using a variety of mathematical language. The children reflected on when this would be useful in real life.
Year 2	This week in English we have continued to explore the fictional town of Crabby Spit. We have investigated how tourist destinations advertise themselves using brochures and leaflets. We have spent time thinking about the bossy verbs we could use to encourage people to visit, what adjectives would best describe the activities and what illustrations would catch the eye. The children have produced some amazing brochures!	In Maths we have finished our unit on time and started our unit on weights and measures. The children have spent time comparing weights, weighing items using different scales and looking at measuring in g and kg.
Year 3	Year 3 have enjoyed doing some research to support their learning about India and the River Ganges. They have made some wonderful information posters. We are absolutely loving our class novel (another one by Tom Fletcher, who Year 3 seem to love!) called <i>The Creakers</i> . Ask your child what THEY would get up to if all the adults in the world had mysteriously disappeared.....!	Our maths work has been fun and practical this week. We have been exploring the properties of 2D and 3D shape. We have learnt a lot of new mathematical vocabulary such as <i>parallel</i> , <i>perpendicular</i> and <i>symmetrical</i> and we have visualised 3D shapes using 2D pictures.
Year 4	This week the children have been reflecting on their time in Hampreston ahead of our Leavers' Service in a few weeks. The children have written some beautiful poems thinking about some of their favourite memories in Hampreston and how they have grown during their time from Reception until now.	In Maths the children have worked very hard and have had lots of fun completing our unit on co-ordinates. They are able to record points on a grid and even transpose these to a different part of the grid using co-ordinates to describe the movement.
