This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
EYFS	This week Reception have been on a hunt for minibeasts! We have learnt the names for different minibeasts and discussed what a microhabitat is. We were inspired by the book 'We're going on a bear hunt' to go on our very own bug hunt around the playground. The children showed excellent teamwork in hunting and identifying different creepy crawlies! We have been painting camouflaged butterflies, building bugs from small items, constructing bug hotels and making our own antenna as we role played with our friends.	
	In English, we have been writing minibeast fact files which we are going to turn into our very own non-fiction book! Did you know snails have rows of teeth on their tongues?!	numbers. The children were able to sort odd and even numbers on a Venn diagram and completed worksheets independently where they had to put matching socks into pairs to identify if they were an odd or even amount.
Year 1	This week in English we have been reading the fairy tale of The Three Billy Goats Gruff. We discussed what makes up a traditional fairy tale then sequenced the story using pictures. We also came up with adjectives for the different characters and looked at speech and the key phrases that each character used throughout the story.	In maths this week we have been looking at money. We have identified coins and notes and compared their values. We also looked at using different coins to make up the same value. We did this through role play with children having to pay the bus driver 20p using different coins.
Year 2	This week in English the children have been writing postcards. We have read 'Sally and the Limpet' by Simon James and imagined we have gone on an exciting beach holiday. We have discussed the activities you can do at the beach and written to our friends and family. The children have had a great time thinking of their ideal holiday and what they would get up to.	In Maths this week we have finished our statistics unit. We have drawn our own pictograms, learnt how to interpret data and represent data in different ways using 2, 5 and 10 multiplication facts. We have also been working hard on our reasoning skills, focusing on explaining how we know the answer not just giving the solution.
Year 3	This week in English, the children have been learning about explanation texts. We have looked at one called 'How to make a rainbow' and discussed the features. The children have then used their RE knowledge of the River Ganges and have written their own explanation text using subheadings, formal language, facts and pictures. I am very impressed with their presentation.	This week, year 3 have finished off their shape topic. We had a very fun lesson building 3D shapes using marshmallows and cocktail sticks! They have impressed me with their knowledge of identifying shapes by their properties. Towards the end of the week, we have started out new unit on statistics and interpreting data. Next week, the children will be gathering their own data and putting it into a bar chart.
Year 4	This week the children have been planning, drafting and editing their own versions of the <i>Egyptian Cinderella</i> story. They have drawn on all of their learning from this term to write some of the most gripping and detailed stories they have written this year. We are truly proud of all of their hard work!	In maths the children have finished their topic of shape. They have looked at different types of regular and irregular polygons, looked at lines of symmetry in polygons and in different symmetric patterns. They have also completed some different maths test papers in which they have drawn on all of the different topics from this term.
