This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
	This week we have been inventors and have designed and created our own invention to solve the world's problems.	
EYFS	In English, we have been reading Julia Donaldson's book 'Stickman' and have used it to explore rhyme and cause and effect. We linked the book to our understanding of the four seasons and loved creating our own stickmen in exploring time.	In Maths, we have been learning to identify 3D shapes and have used them to create prints and patterns. We have continued to develop our knowledge of number bonds to 10 also.
Year 1	This week in English Year 1 have been reading how to grow a dinosaur. We split the story up into sections the beginning, middle and end. Using the same story format the children then started to plan their own story of how to grow an animal of their own choice. First they created a picture story board and then started to plan their writing.	In maths this week Year 1 have been partitioning numbers up to 50. We used base 10 cubes to help us work out how many 10's and 1's are in a given number. We used partwhole models to help us partition using just the number form too.
Year 2	This week in English we have been writing Easter senses poems. The children have thought carefully about how Easter makes them feel, what they may be able to taste and see. The children have worked hard on their presentation and stepped up to the challenge of including a simile or two!	In Maths this week we have continued our unit on mass, capacity and measure. We have investigated measuring in kilograms, millilitres and litres. We have also used the four operations to solve problems related to mass and compared volume and capacity.
Year 3	The children have loved making their posters for Enterprise week using imperative verbs (bossy words!) They are very excited to have them hanging up for you all to see. This week, year 3 have also completed an unaided write based on a video clip 'megacity'. The children all tried hard remembering those full stops and capital letters!	Year 3 finished off their mass and capacity unit this week, focussing on adding mass and capacity. The children are all doing very well with their timetables as well. I seem to be handing out more and more cracking timetables certificates! Go year 3!
Year 4	It has been another exciting week in Year 4. The children had a great time on our trip to the solar farm and the follow up visit looking at solar circuits was so much fun too!	
	The children have been getting ready for our enterprise sale this week by planning out and costing different activities in order to make a profit. They have created advertising posters and have written some very persuasive advertisement slogans to drum up as much business as possible!	In maths the children have started their new topic of decimals. They have really enjoyed looking at the relationships between tenths and fractions, representing decimals using place value charts and identifying them on different number lines.
