SEN parent network

Being a parent is not always easy and sometimes it is good to just talk and listen with other parents, particularly if your child has additional needs that make life more challenging. Lost Property

The Lost Property Box is beginning to spill over again! Please name all of your child's clothing and equipment, and also claim anything you think has gone missing. Many thanks.

Communication

I would like to thank you so much for the many encouraging and positive comments you have taken the time to give me in the playground. Our valued relationship with you means so much and I have passed your thanks and support on to the teachers and support staff. I genuinely want all of you to feel free to speak to your child's teacher or to me about anything you feel affects your child's life at school and we always welcome open communication, via email, phone call or face to face – whichever you feel most comfortable with.

I am also aware that communication in WhatsApp groups has both positive and negative impacts. Could I gently remind us all that any questions or concerns relating to the school would be better asked directly to us to ensure that information is balanced and accurate and that children's identities are protected.

Earrings

We have noticed an increasing number of children wearing earrings to school on PE days, including some hoop and larger earrings. As per our uniform policy children are permitted to wear 1 small stud earring in each ear to school if they wish. On PE days children should not come to school wearing earrings to help us keep all children as safe as possible in PE lessons. Where this is not possible, children should be able to remove their own earrings before the start of each PE lesson and put them back in themselves at the end. If they cannot do this, please could you provide suitable tape and ensure your child can sufficiently tape their own earrings until they can be taken out, as per the guidance in Association for Physical Education Safe Practice in Physical Education, used by schools nationally. If for any reason this is not possible, children may not be able to join in the practical part of the PE lesson, but will be given an alternative role such as referee, umpire or scorer. Thank you for your cooperation.

Nits

Unfortunately, we have had reports of these most unwelcome visitors in school. Over the weekend, please take the chance to double-check your child's hair. Please seek treatment if needed. Chemists can offer advice, but the use of hair conditioner and a nit-comb can be effective too. Additionally, please ensure that all long hair is tied back as per our school guidelines. This will help to prevent the spread of these pesky blighters. Thanks

Parent Governor Election

The constitution of our governing body includes two parent governors: we currently have one parent governor – Mrs Bird - and we have one vacancy, which needs to be filled.

Would any parent or carer of pupils registered at the School wish to put their name forward for this role?

All parents and carers are eligible to stand for election, except

- · Persons liable to be detained under the Mental Health Act 1983
- · Undischarged bankrupts
- · Persons recently convicted of a serious offence
- · Persons disqualified under the Company Directors Disqualification Act 1986
- · Persons subject to disqualification as a Charity Trustee
- · Persons whose employment is prohibited or restricted
- · Persons disqualified from being proprietors of independent schools
- · Persons on the DfES List 99 (this is a list of people banned from working with children)

If you would like to put your name forward or would like more information about what being a parent governor entails, please email the Clerk, Deborah Trickett (d.trickett@hampreston.dorset.sch.uk) by 13th October 2023.

After this deadline, the Clerk will organise a ballot and will invite all nominees to submit a brief factual statement about themselves for circulation with the ballot paper to everyone entitled to vote. If only one nominee comes forward, that parent will be automatically elected without the need for a vote.

This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
	It's superhero week! We began the week by designing our own superhero masks and discussing what superpowers we would like to have and why. We have been building superhero cities out of numicon, avoiding string lasers in the outside classroom and rescuing superheroes from rope traps!	
EYFS	In Phonics this week, we have learnt to read and write the sounds /g/ /o/ /c/ and /k/ and have worked in small groups to identify the initial sounds of words. We have been practising our CVC blending and we started our new guided reading groups where we really enjoyed looking at books and talking about different topics. In drawing club, we read the story 'Supertato' and designed our own super vegetable!	In Maths, we have been using language to compare amounts including fewer and more, least and most. We have been exploring height and building towers to describe different heights. We have been using our class height chart to measure our own heights. Most of us are as tall as a flamingo!
Year 1	This week in English Year 1 have been using the story of 'We're going on a Bear Hunt.' We have looked at the different vocabulary used within the story and drawn a story map to help us remember how the story is structured. We have also been practising our spoken language by performing and acting out the story with our own actions.	In maths this week Year 1 have done lots of work on number lines. We drew our own number lines to 10 on the playground and then did practical challenges finding and jumping on different numbers. We remembered to jump to the right to find a number that was greater and jump to the left to find a number that was smaller. We also carefully counted the number of jumps it took us to get to a specific number.
Year 2	This week in English we have been investigating the different styles of poetry and how they do not always follow the sentence structure of a story or description. We have written our own acrostic poems for the Harvest Service next week. The children have been very imaginative and thought carefully about how they can describe what Harvest means to them while following the structure of a poem.	In Maths this week we have finished our place value topic. We have revisited counting in 2s, 5s and 10s from any number, filling in missing numbers on a number line and recognised patterns in our counting. The children have worked very hard to consolidate and extend their learning from Year 1.
Year 3	This week in English, we have planned and written a recount of our trip to Leeson House. We spoke about the features of a recount and I was very impressed with these features put into action! All children used 1 st person narrative, wrote in past tense and sequenced their recount correctly. I even had some fantastic adjectives thrown in! Well done Year 3!	In Maths we have been consolidating our place value knowledge through addition and subtraction using a place value chart. This involved having to exchange from the 10's and 100's column. A tricky concept, but with the use of base 10 manipulatives, the children understood it better.
Year 4	In English this week, we have focussed on letter writing, specifically planning, editing, and improving letters to Mrs Richardson from the perspective of a character from our story, 'Stone Age Boy'. The children have practised putting themselves in someone else's shoes, developing a deep understanding of their character's perspective. They have also developed their editing skills, where emphasis is placed on proofreading, grammar and punctuation, and effective word choice.	In maths, we are currently focusing on adding 4-digit numbers. The children have been introduced to both non-exchange and single exchange using formal methods. They have developed their understanding of place value and the importance of carrying or exchanging numbers in the appropriate columns. We encourage you to practice these concepts with your child at home, reinforcing their learning with real-life examples and activities.
