This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
EYFS	our new outdoor equipment. In English, we have been continuing our learning about Little Red Riding Hood using props and costumes to act out the story with our friends and learning about recipes by	
Year 1	decorating our own coronation biscuits! In English this week, Year 1 have looked at VCOP: Vocabulary, Conjunctions and Punctuation to help make our writing more exciting. The children chose suitable adjectives to describe different animals. They tried to extend their sentences using the conjunctions and, but and because. They also used their knowledge of adjectives to describe King Charles as part of our Coronation celebrations.	in full sentences. This week in Maths, Year 1 finished the unit of work on Volume and Capacity. We compared the capacity of different containers and tried to estimate how many cups it would take to fill them up. We then had a go at some challenging 2 step problems converting all measurements into cups so we could work out which container had the biggest capacity even though they were different shapes and sizes. We also started our work on Multiplication and Division starting to count in 2's and 10's.
Year 2	This week in English we have investigated the day Mary Anning found the Ichthyosaur skeleton. We have imagined the lead up to finding the bones, how she would have felt and what her dreams may have been for her life following the discovery. The children have then gone on to write a diary entry, focusing on using exciting vocabulary, correct punctuation and sentence structure.	In Maths this week we have continued our unit on fractions. We have looked at unit fractions, non-unit fractions and started to understand the equivalence of a half and two quarters.
Year 3	This week, Year 3 have started a new book called 'Brain Freeze' by Tom Fletcher. They are really enjoying it. Taking a scene from the story, the children have acted out a conversation between the main character's brain and tummy. The children have then written out the dialogue using the correct punctuation.	This week, Year 3 have continued with the unit 'money'. We have had the coins and notes out in lessons so children can see how to exchange notes for coins when adding, subtracting and finding change.
Year 4	This week the children have been planning and writing a newspaper article. They have imagined that they are the first reporter on the scene in 1922 to report on the discovery of an incredibly special tomb in the Valley of the Kings. They have edited their work and will also be typing it up just like a real newspaper report.	In maths we have been continuing our focus on decimals. The children are becoming more comfortable with ordering, comparing and rounding decimals, as well as finding the equivalent decimals to a half and a quarter.
