With the planned NEU industrial action impacting schools across the country, we have worked closely with colleagues in our local schools to rearrange this important day, which will now take place on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> July. # This Week:

To help support you at home and to spark conversations about learning, here is what the children have been covering this week.

	English	Mathematics
EYFS	The children have blown me away in English this week as they have challenged themselves to rewrite the story of The Gingerbread Man! They have used capital letters, full stops, finger spaces and their phonics skills to write amazing recounts.	In Maths, we have been problem solving using addition. We have linked our Maths learning to our favourite stories including Mr Gumpy's Outing and The Gingerbread Man. We investigated floating and sinking, identifying which materials floated and counted how many counters it took for them to sink.
Year 1	In English year 1 worked hard on using interesting sentence openers to retell the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff. They also tried to include the adjectives and speech in their stories that they practised last week.	This week in maths year 1 started learn about time. They started by using the vocabulary 'before and after', then used songs and rhymes to help them remember and order the day of the week and months of the year.
Year 2	This week in English the children have started planning tourist brochures! We have read the book 'On the beach' by Roland Harvey and thought about the activities we could get up to at the beach. The children have thought about what activities would be most popular and the vocabulary they could use to persuade people to visit. We will continue the brochures next week and I look forward to reading them!	In Maths this week we have started our position and direction unit. We have practised describing our position in relation to our friends, for example 'I am to the right of him' 'I am standing in between my friends'. The children have done a great job of explaining the route someone could take to get to a designated place.
Year 3	This week in English, we have had a look at colour poetry. The children loved making up their own similes to describe coloured items that were hidden in the bag. I was really impressed with not only the adjectives they used, but the fantastic similes.	This week in maths, the children have been interpreting data from a range of bar charts. They have enjoyed comparing bar charts to see how data can be shown. We have also drawn our own bar charts, making sure rulers have been used!
Year 4	This week has been a busy one in Year 4. They children have been using their <i>Egyptian Cinderella</i> stories to create books that they will be reading with the children in Reception later this term. They also came to a decision about how to spend their Enterprise Week money. I am very proud of the mature discussions that we had as a class, and the children generously decided to give £90 to Cancer Research and the Dog's Trust.	In maths the children have been looking at position and direction. They have looked at how to read and plot coordinates on a grid, how to draw 2-D shapes on a grid and even looked at how to translate points and shapes by using their knowledge of coordinates.
